### BUSINESS ENGAGEMENT











Established in 2021, Beer & Business is a signature networking event hosted by the Stafford EDA. Held quarterly, this dynamic gathering has successfully facilitated **15** events to date, each drawing an average of 60 local professionals. Beer & Business provides a relaxed yet productive environment for business leaders to connect, exchange ideas, and build valuable relationships within Stafford's thriving professional community. In addition, the event communicates partnership opportunities to over **60** businesses and highlights available EDA resources, supporting growth and collaboration in the region.









The Veterans Business Bootcamp (VBB) is an annual event dedicated to empowering the military and veteran community to invest in Stafford County's economic landscape. Established in 2016 in partnership with the UMW Small Business Development Center, VBB provides tailored support to veterans who are either launching a business or looking to enhance their existing operations. The program covers critical topics such as government contracting, financial management, human resources, and marketing strategies, ensuring that veteran entrepreneurs have the tools and knowledge needed to thrive in today's competitive market.









The 30th Anniversary of the Business Appreciation Reception celebrated three decades of Stafford's vibrant business community, honoring outstanding local businesses with distinguished awards. Established in **1993**, this annual event serves as a cornerstone for recognizing the achievements and contributions of Stafford's business leaders. Featuring special guest speakers, business awards, and opportunities for networking, the reception fosters camaraderie and highlights the collective success that continues to drive Stafford's economic growth.

### BUSINESS RESOURCES FUND 2024



The **Business Resources Fund**, a dedicated committee in Stafford County, Virginia, plays a vital role in supporting and fostering local business growth and innovation. In 2024, the fund backed impactful initiatives such as Kilroy Robotics, the VA Black Business Chamber, and the Business Acumen Series, contributing to the county's vibrant entrepreneurial landscape and community development.



The EDA continues their support of STEM education with a \$10,000 annual donation to support Kilroy Robotics, a STEM education organization in Stafford Schools.









The EDA allocates another \$10,000 to fund an annual 50 seats for Stafford businesses to attend the UMW Business Acumen Series, promoting business development and education.









The Stafford EDA generously supported the annual Christmas Tree lighting event through funding management, helping to bring this cherished community tradition to life.









The EDA approves a \$10,000 Accelerator Grant to be awarded to Virginia Black Business Chamber of Commerce.

### GERMANNA COMMUNITY COLLEGE



The Stafford EDA donated \$750,000 towards establishing a permanent site for Germanna Community College in Stafford in support of local education and workforce development.





### AJGA OUTCOMES



Over the past three years, the Stafford Economic Development Authority (EDA) has proudly contributed \$75,000 to support the annual AJGA Golf Tournament. This prestigious event has had a significant local impact, generating approximately \$774,062 in direct economic activity and \$321,195 in visitor spending. Additionally, the tournament has raised around \$131,980 for local charitable organizations, including the AJGA ACE Grant, Special Olympics Virginia, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Fredericksburg, Stafford Education Foundation, Stafford Junction, SerVe, and the Stafford County Fire & Rescue Foundation, underscoring its commitment to both economic growth and community enrichment.

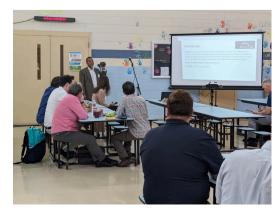
Launched in 2020, the GO Virginia Grant has become a cornerstone of economic development and innovation in the region, securing vital funding to promote growth across various sectors. In its inaugural year, the Stafford Economic Development Authority (EDA) championed the GO Virginia Smart Technology Expansion Project, supporting a \$96,250 planning grant aimed at expanding smart technology solutions throughout Region 6. Through strategic workshops and planning sessions with local governments, this initiative laid the foundation for tech-driven progress.

Building on this momentum, in 2021, the EDA was awarded a \$215,000 GO Virginia grant to establish a regional Internet of Things (IoT) Accelerator Program. This program has been instrumental in fostering entrepreneurship in the smart technology sector, positioning Stafford as a hub for innovation. Most recently, in 2023, the EDA received a \$195,000 GO Virginia grant to expand the Testbed Entrepreneurial Ecosystem across Region 6. This initiative continues to fuel business development by providing startups and growing companies with the resources they need to thrive.

The impact of the GO Virginia Grant on the local community has been transformative. By advancing cuttingedge technologies and nurturing a thriving entrepreneurial ecosystem, these grants have not only spurred economic growth but also created opportunities for local businesses and innovators to lead in smart tech solutions, ultimately enhancing the region's competitive edge.
